

CURBO NOTES

- Road is in beautiful shape. Base was done right.
- Whatever we have been doing is spot on. Great plan.
- Doesn't recommend seal coating, doesn't add to longevity.
- Crack filling is important
- Infrared a great process, great way to go
- Don't need to mill it now. Do it in 1 to 3 years.
 - Will last about 15 years. Won't get 27 years from a 2" mill.
 - But you can do multiple redo's cheaper than putting in a whole new road.
 - Cracks are in the base and will transfer through.
- Alligating – soil holds moisture; need to take down to base.
- Weather deteriorates the road.
- When we pursue road replacement, CurbcO recommends a tapered milling process with a 2-inch cold milling at the curb to 0-inches at the center to increase the crown of the road. An increased crown will improve drainage and along with better drainage, a longer road life. (NOTE from Brian: This would reduce the amount of asphalt needed to be hauled away by about 50% and we should be able to get a reduced price based on less to haul away)
